TVLC Kids is beginning an exciting new series called *The Great Escape!*

If you've ever heard of an escape room, you know the goal is pretty clear: to escape! In the book of Exodus, God's people had the same goal when they became enslaved by

the nation of Egypt. In an escape room, a group of friends must work together to follow instructions, solve puzzles, and discover clues that will help them find freedom. In the story of the Exodus, God's people find freedom by witnessing God's miracles and following God's leadership through Moses. You may never be trapped in a room or taken captive by an enemy country, but there might be a time when you need some help from God. In this 4-week series, kids will see that, when they're in trouble, God can send people to help them, God can help them do great things, God can do anything, and God is with them.

DEVOTIONS: *Read: Luke 17:11-19.* Paul Tillich, a famous theologian once pointed out that faith is accepting that the unacceptable has been accepted. According to the law of Israel, a leper was unclean and needed to be kept away from the community. Lepers were unacceptable-or at least those who are to be avoided. A Samaritan was despised by first century Jews. Not only does Jesus accept and heal the Samaritan leperalong with nine other lepers-but this leper is the one who responds with a thankful heart at the feet of Jesus. Just like Naaman, the enemy general from Aram (Syria), those who seem far from God's presence and God's people are included in God's work of mercy and salvation. As Jesus says to the Samaritan leper, "your faith has made you well" (v. 19). God's work of salvation often comes as a work of great surprise to us. How does God's mercy give you courage to trust that God cares for you? **Pray:** Merciful Savior, thank you for reaching out to those who seem far from you; thank you for reaching out to me. Amen.

SERVICE: This week's scripture readings tell of healings. Improved public health care is needed in many parts of the world. Some of it is provided by missionaries who show God's love by giving much needed food, clean water, mosquito nets, medical treatment, and other care around the world. How can you contribute to or support these faithful missionaries?

<u>RITUALS AND TRADITIONS:</u> God is holy and awesome. (Psalm 111:9) Take a walk around your neighborhood and make a list of things you see that are awesome. Trees, buildings, the sky, and clouds are a few of the things you might see. Then sit down in your home and look at the list. God is bigger and greater than anything we see. Take time to say a prayer of praise to God and be thankful for "his wonderful deeds", "the power of his works", and "the work of his MILES ONES hands" (Psalm 111:4, 6, 7). © 2018 Milestones Ministry, LLC.

are encouraged to take an active role in worship leadership. *Nursery care* is also available until noon for those who desire.


